#### Care Boxes for our recent Graduates

We did not have an opportunity to recognize our recent graduates before some of them left for college. We would like to do so by pulling together Care Boxes with items helpful when they hit a stressful day, get caught with no snacks, end up quarantined or sick, or just need a break.

If you would like to donate any of the following to include in their boxes please leave them on the memorial room table before September 15.

- \*Thermometer (does not need to be fancy)
- \*Body Lotion/baby oil
- \*Toothbrush, Toothpaste,
- \*Shampoo/Conditioner,
- \*Hair comb/brush, Hair Ties or a hat

- \*Cough Drops
- \*Something to bring fever down, help with aches
- \*Tissues
- \*Ziplock bags (useful for disposal of potentially contagious tissues)
- \*Snacks
- \*Candy
- \*Instant soup
- \*masks
- \*Hand sanitizer
- \*Disinfectant wipes and cleaners
- \*Disposable gloves 20 pairs per box
- \*Some sort of distraction- such as a coloring book and crayons or a deck of cards,
- \*Powdered drink mix to mix in water

A note of encouragement – share a story of when you were away from home and lonely, stressed, or sick.

We will add a light blanket throw and some suggested information forms for them to keep in the box. As well as a couple of cards of encouragement they can read as needed.

### **FINANCE**

We started 2020 with a positive balance of \$4,120.28 in our Current Expense account and as of July 31, 2020 we have a positive balance of \$8,989.69, however, we have not paid our shared ministries for February, March, April, May, June and July totaling \$13,134.00. Our year to date income as of July 31, 2020 was \$85,507.16 and our year to date expenses equaled \$80,637.75. Our income has been \$4,869.41 higher than our expenses. If the previous payments were made our year to date expenses would have been \$8,264.59 more than our income. We were able to pay our August apportionments in full!

Thank you to all who have been attending our weekly Farmer's Market every Wednesday from 4:30 – 7pm. The market will run through September 30, 2020. Thank you to all who attended our food booth during the Newfane Harvest Car Cruise on Saturday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>. Thank you for your support and continued support of our church!

We have submitted the documentation and applied for forgiveness of our Federal PPP loan that we received in May on July 31<sup>st</sup>. We hope and expect this loan will be turned into a grant. As soon as we hear one way or another we will let you know in our monthly article.

During the pandemic we have been counting money around the 15<sup>th</sup> and the 30<sup>th</sup> of each month.

## Through the Wilderness



## Worship/Sunday School plan

An initial plan follows. It is a fluid plan, subject to change as we live into new ways to be the faith community known as United Methodists in Newfane NY. Your suggestions and questions are welcome.

#### **Sundays**

#### 9:45 a.m. Family worship

(families with young children to teens planning to participate in Sunday School would have priority seating for this service)

#### **ENVIRONMENT:**

Casual

Seating by reserved family unit or (bubble, group that has been in close contact on a regular basis)

Masks and social distancing necessary

#### WORSHIP STYLE:

Casual with elements of traditional worship Music Videos

Opening focused on children – music, scripture, Children's Moment (recorded for insertion in online/in person worship later that morning)

Children/Youth excused to go to Class for follow up activities related to morning message approximately 10:05 a.m.

Adults stay in sanctuary for message and time for Q&A

Children/Youth return to sanctuary 10:35 a.m.

Closing includes prayer, music video, benediction (out by 11:50 a.m.)



#### 11:15 a.m. In-person/Online worship

(anyone, "Save a Seat" pre-registration helpful)

#### **ENVIRONMENT:**

In sanctuary seating by reserved family unit or bubble, (group that has been in close contact on a regular basis)

In sanctuary masks, social distancing, and oneway travel required.

WORSHIP STYLE: Primarily traditional worship elements

Organist, vocalists, instrumentalists

Traditional format

Concludes between noon and 12:15 p.m.

#### **ANYTIME – not necessarily Sunday**

(small groups/watch parties)

#### **ENVIRONMENT:**

Home of someone in your "Bubble" Level of pre-cautions based on who is present and/or number present

WORSHIP STYLE: Use written copies of Sunday's message and/or recording of Sunday's 11:15 a.m. Service as basis of worship. Discussion points/children's activities available. Live interaction with pastor on phone/online possible depending on the time set for the gathering, response to any questions, comments shared with entire group in communication style (note, email, phone call, etc.) before the group comes together again when meeting at a time pastor not available.
